Sermon

In our set reading for today, we find Jesus in Galilee, being warned by some Pharisees that Herod wanted to kill Him. It is unusual to find these Pharisees almost trying to protect Jesus, and one has to wonder whether their apparent friendship was genuine, or whether they just wanted to frighten Jesus into moving out of their area as it were. But Jesus knows all things, even the very thoughts of men, and His response is to Herod when he says "Go tell that foxI shall finish my work."

Jesus deliberately describes Herod as a fox for he was cunning and sly, subtle and treacherous. Jesus does not fear Herod and his threats, because He knows this is not part of Gods plan, for He goes on to say that "it is not right for a prophet to be killed anywhere except in Jerusalem." This is the place that the Sanhedrin court sat, the only court that tried so called 'false prophets' and condemned them to death.

Jerusalem, the Holy City of God, as recognised by all the Abrahamic religions, Judaism, Christianity and Islam. King David established it as the capital of the united Israel and his son, King Solomon built the first temple in the city. To many its importance lies in a sentimental past, King David conquered the city and brought the Ark of the Covenant.

Luke 13 v34 - "Jerusalem! Jerusalem! You kill the prophets, you stone the messengers God has sent you! How many times have I wanted to put my arms round all your people, just as a hen gathers her chicks under her wings, but you would not let me!"

Have you ever spent some time on the farm and seen free range hens? I visited a farm the other day, where I saw a new breed of chicken. It had 12 legs! I thought what a fantastic idea, it means all the guests at the dinner table get to have a leg each – how brilliant. Then I thought to myself 'I wonder what these new chickens would taste like?' But then I thought 'I bet nobody knows 'cos they won't be able to catch one!' But when I asked the farmer about them he called me a fool – and said 'that hens not got 12 legs – it's got 5 chicks under it's wing!'

You see, that's how the caring mother offers protection for her young; she offers comfort and warmth and security. Shelter from the rain, out of harm's way, hidden in her wings. She spreads her wings out so that her young may run to her for safety. Does this not illustrate perfectly the compassion of Christ?

Let's look at what Jerusalem meant to Jesus. Was it not the city that God himself had chosen through His servant David? Didn't Jesus have a conversation with the woman from Samaria concerning the place where one should worship the true God? The home of the temple, the place of the feasts and festivals, to which ever Jew made a pilgrimage at least once in their lifetime. Steeped in history for God's chosen people, and here Jesus shows such compassion for this chosen nation of people whose heart and culture radiated from this great city when he laments for them in this scripture from Luke's gospel. It's an agonising plea of what could have been if only they had listened. If only they had not been so hard hearted and stubborn towards the Son of God. And yet Jesus here does not curse these stiff-necked people, He has already given them stern warnings, but now he laments for them.

We are also told in Luke 19 v 41 that as Jesus approached the city of Jerusalem "He wept over it." Like a hen would sense danger when birds of prey hover over head, and spread her wings and signal to her chicks making sure they are safe whilst exposing herself to the danger, so Jesus protects us from Gods judgement which hangs over us and has left himself exposed to it in our stead. And like a hen stretches out her wings to save her chicks, so Jesus stretched out His arms to save His children. The children of God, those whom He chose, those who respond to His love. This wonderful salvation freely given so that we may freely receive.

And yet Jesus still laments today for all the lost souls of the world, especially for those who gather in His house and yet still don't know Him. Those who live in this community and still haven't heard about him.

Do we lament also when we look around and cry out, 'Oh people how long has Jesus longed to put His arms around you and love you, but you would not listen?' Is Jesus calling to you this day? Are you the lost child of today?

Psalm 17 v 8 says "Hide me in the shadow of your wings. Psalm 63 v 7 says "You have always been my help, in the shadow of your wings I sing for joy." Psalm 91 v 4 says "He will cover you with his wings, you will be safe in his care"

Amazing love, that He should show such pity to a people who were about to call for His crucifixion. It illustrates the mercy of God, the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ that he who was about to suffer at their mercy could show such mercy and forgiveness in return, and yet we have no or little compassion for those that do not know of the love of this man is incredible in itself. The very lack of our zeal for what our saviour has done for us is in itself an injustice to this man Jesus. For I believe Jesus would have us weep and lament for our world rather than curse and condemn it like we often do today.

When Jesus appears to His disciples after the resurrection we read in Luke 24 v 47 that He says "The message about repentance and the forgiveness of sins must be preached to all nations — beginning in Jerusalem" Even after they had done their worst, Jesus still shows compassion for them and wants them to be saved. Incredible love. A love that can be ours too if only we repent and accept Jesus into our lives as Lord and Saviour. Amen.
