Symbol 1 – An Apple

To help remind us that in the beginning we were at one with God, but we broke our promise to God, we sinned, and our sin separates us from God.

Reading: Genesis 3 v 8-15

Then the man and his wife heard the sound of the Lord God as he was walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and they hid from the Lord God among the trees of the garden. But the Lord God called to the man, 'Where are you?' He answered, 'I heard you in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; so I hid.' And he said, 'Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree from which I commanded you not to eat?' The man said, 'The woman you put here with me – she gave me some fruit from the tree, and I ate it.' Then the Lord God said to the woman, 'What is this you have done?' The woman said, 'The snake deceived me, and I ate.'

So the Lord God said to the snake, 'Because you have done this, 'Cursed are you above all livestock and all wild animals! You will crawl on your belly and you will eat dust all the days of your life. And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will crush your head, and you will strike his heel.'

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Symbol 2 – A Scroll

To show that Christ's birth was foretold many years before it happened. That the prophecy said that Christ would forever be our role model and our guide, bringing light and peace into a world of darkness.

Reading: Isaiah 9 v 2, 6-7

The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of deep darkness a light has dawned. For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the greatness of his government and peace there will be no end. He will reign on David's throne and over his kingdom, establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and for ever. The zeal of the Lord Almighty will accomplish this.

Symbol 3 – An Angel

To show that Christ's coming into the world was so truly special that it required an Angel to announce it. He is God made man. God amongst us.

Reading: Luke 1 v 26-38

In the sixth month of Elizabeth's pregnancy, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary. The angel went to her and said, 'Greetings, you who are highly favoured! The Lord is with you.' Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be. But the angel said to her, 'Do not be afraid, Mary, you have found favour with God. You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over Jacob's descendants for ever; his kingdom will never end.' 'How will this be,' Mary asked the angel, 'since I am a virgin?' The angel answered, 'The Holy Spirit will come on you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God. Even Elizabeth your relative is going to have a child in her old age, and she who was said to be unable to conceive is in her sixth month. For no word from God will ever fail.' 'I am the Lord's servant,' Mary answered. 'May your word to me be fulfilled.' Then the angel left her.

The Annunciation Monologue

I cannot, to this day, tell you why it happened. I cannot, to this day, tell you how it happened. Maybe I fell asleep. Perhaps it was all a dream. But this I know... this I thought in my mind... It had been a busy day. There had been much to do, sweeping, cleaning, mending, baking, dusting, bed-making. I was alone and very tired. Perhaps I just nodded off - just for a moment, you understand. But I know there was a bright light, and, for a moment, great fear, and then the voice... How could I invent these things? I am a young girl, I know so little...

There was a voice in the light, saying, "God has blessed you, Mary.' Yes, it said my name, just like that! And I did not feel blessed, only very, very frightened. But I listened... 'You will conceive a son, and call him Jesus. And he will be the Son of God.' He calls this a blessing! To be a disgrace to my family, to be a disgrace to Joseph, to never be fit to marry. What kind of blessing can possibly come from this? What blessing could there be in a child conceived in this way? And the Son of God! This is madness! Yet the voice went on..."You will have a child, born of the Holy Spirit, a sacred, holy child. Do not be afraid? Then, suddenly, the light was gone, and with it went my fear. I moved, and found that my heart was saying 'Let it be as God wills. I am his to command. What will come, will come. Just as the Lord wills it.'

Symbol 4 – A Lamb and Crown

To explain that Jesus is both the Son of God, a wonderful King, worthy of our praise AND that in coming amongst us he was perfect like a newborn lamb, and that he lived a perfect life.

Reading: Luke 2 v 1-14

In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) And everyone went to their own town to register. So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them.

And there were shepherds living out in the fields near by, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Saviour has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign to you: you will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger.' Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying, 'Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favour rests.'

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Reflection

I wonder what would you like for Christmas?

I grew up in a family where, rather than surprise each other, we tended to check out what we'd like to get. So on Christmas Day there were few surprises but much satisfaction. CS Lewis, writing in simpler times and before the internet, already saw the danger of the commercial bustle which makes Christmas so busy that Christ is in danger of getting squeezed out. These days the incessant tug of technology forces us to attend to a wide range of Christmas greetings randomly popping up on WhatsApp, Facebook, the app formerly known as Twitter, email and good old-fashioned cards! My problem is that I keep losing track of who has greeted me, where and how, and if I have actually replied!

I wonder what would you like for Christmas?

I'd like a little more time and a little less pressure, please. Some families are choosing not to do gifts this Christmas, recognising the pressure of the cost of living. Others are choosing to donate to charity in the name of their loved ones. And in the background – as an eco-church community - I shudder at the environmental impact of printing, sending and binning so many Christmas Cards. Yet I've always preferred something real to something electronic! A difficult one to resolve...

I wonder what would you like for Christmas?

If you're living in a war zone - like the ordinary people of Gaza/Israel and eastern Ukraine/Russia - I'm sure they would desperately want the fighting to stop. All the talk of peace on earth and goodwill to humankind rings hollow when you're not experiencing it.

I wonder what would you like for Christmas?

I'd like a new baby please. (Sorry Michele – that's not meant to be a surprise!) No not just any baby. The one in the manger. I'd like a chance to stop and wonder at what it means for the God of the Universe, the mighty Word through whom all things were made, to become vulnerable and dwell among us. I'd like to have time, like the shepherds and wise men, to simply gaze at God's most precious gift to us and wonder at the gift of love this represents. Sometimes we might feel angry with God for the state of the world. We might cry out to God, "Why don't you do something?" And our gracious mother God in heaven replies: "I have done something. I sent you this baby. Stop and listen to his message and invite others to do the same!"

We can't fix the problems of wars in far distant places. But we can fix the family feuds which are closer to home. We don't need to take offence, even where someone is trying to give it. We don't need to insist that the other person has to say sorry first. We can extend the olive branch to anyone we've been in conflict with. That would be a beautiful gift for the baby – wouldn't it?

I wonder what would you like for Christmas?

I'd like church to reach out beyond its walls making new connections to young and old, black and white, gay and straight, tall and short, single and partnered... I'd like some new people to visit church, to know a welcome so wonderful, generous and graceful that they are drawn into the life of our community of faith until they find their own faith in this wonderful mystery of God in Christ... until they become part of the church family. If you're here today and you don't often go to church, know that you are welcome. And why not make going to church your new year's resolution? The Bible promises that if you – if we all seek God and really want to find God, then God will be there for you. And to those here who are church regulars, remember when you go to Church for Christmas, to greet the strangers and the visitors before you greet your friends. Mary and Joseph were strangers in a busy, unfamiliar city. Thankfully they were given the greeting of an innkeeper who didn't turn them away but instead made room. Let's have that same spirit of looking out for all in need.

I wonder what would you like for Christmas?

I'd like what I already have, please... Emmanuel, which means God is with us. Here, in the manger, is someone who loves you; he gave his life to save you; and now he is living at your side every day to enlighten, strengthen and free you. He is the original Christmas Gift. He gave himself to us. Let us in our turn give him to the world. Come, Emannuel. Come and bring peace in this place, bring peace to the place of your birth, bring peace to the whole world. And change our hearts, that we may make peace with one another and worship at your feet. Come, Lord Jesus, and do not delay! And may God bless us, every one. Amen

Symbol 5 – A Star

To show us that Jesus was not only King of the Jews but that he came for all people. The Wise Men travelled from far off lands, they were not Jews, and yet God guided them so that they too could worship Jesus. Jesus came for all of us here today. God's star guides us all to him.

Reading: Matthew 2 v 1-11

After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi from the east came to Jerusalem and asked, 'Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him.' When King Herod heard this he was disturbed, and all Jerusalem with him. When he had called together all the people's chief priests and teachers of the law, he asked them where the Messiah was to be born. 'In Bethlehem in Judea,' they replied, 'for this is what the prophet has written: "But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for out of you will come a ruler who will shepherd my people Israel." Then Herod called the Magi secretly and found out from them the exact time the star had appeared. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, 'Go and search carefully for the child. As soon as you find him, report to me, so that I too may go and worship him.' After they had heard the king, they went on their way, and the star they had seen when it rose went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshipped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.

StF 272 – From heaven you came

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Symbol 6 – A Candle

To share the Good News that, just as light in our world is the source of all life – so Jesus is the true light and life of the all the world. Just as a candle guides us in the dark, so too we may come to know Jesus as our friend and guide. By believing in him our sins may be forgiven, and we may become Children of God.

Reading: John 1 v 1-3, 11-14

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him. Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God – children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God. The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

Prayers

Gracious God, be with us this day and this season. Bless us with joy as we engage with this yearly remembrance of the birth of your only son, our Lord Jesus Christ. Grant that as we receive him as our redeemer, so we may have assurance and confidence to approach him when he will come again to be our judge. Jesus, it is you who by your birth into poverty gathers into one; all people and all creation on earth and in heaven. Send the Holy Spirit to grant us inner peace, bless us and this world with much needed goodwill, lead us along the narrow path of sacrifice that is your way, inspiring us to grow more like you. **Amen**
