Introduction

One of my favourite books of the bible in John's first letter. It was written to encourage believers who were going though challenging times and had some people denying the divinity of Jesus. One of the study booklets I have used on 1 John is entitled "How to be sure!" I have nicknamed the letter the "We know, you know" letter because John in those 5 short chapters, John uses the word "know" 45 times. He wants us to know God's love for us, He wants us to

know our identity as children of God even though we are also sinners. He wants us to know forgiveness and purity. He wants us to know eternal life and much more.

Chapter 3 begins with the affirmation of God's lavish love for us that we should be called "children of God", or part of God's family. He longs for us to develop "family likeness" that we are becoming like him. I have been party to many conversations where people talk about family likeness- it may be facial features that are reflected in many members of the family, or build, or character or behaviour.

It's a highly personal letter, and wherever John says "we" – that includes you, wherever he says "you" he means "you". Please insert your own name! The letter will transform you if you open your heart to God's word, seeking to live out our identity as his beloved children.

Reading 1 John 2:28 – 3:10 God's children and sin

²⁸ And now, dear children, continue in him, so that when he appears we may be confident and unashamed before him at his coming. ²⁹ If you **know** that he is righteous, you **know** that everyone who does what is right has been born of him.

3 See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are! The reason the world does not **know** us is that it did not **know** him. ² Dear friends, now we are children of God, and what we will be has not yet been made **know**n. But we **know** that when Christ appears, [a] we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is. ³ All who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure.

⁴ Everyone who sins breaks the law; in fact, sin is lawlessness. ⁵ But you **know** that he appeared so that he might take away our sins. And in him is no sin. ⁶ No one who lives in him keeps on sinning. No one who continues to sin has either seen him or **know**n him.

⁷ Dear children, do not let anyone lead you astray. The one who does what is right is righteous, just as he is righteous. ⁸ The one who does what is sinful is of the devil, because the devil has been sinning from the beginning. The reason the Son of God appeared was to destroy the devil's work. ⁹ No one who is born of God will continue to sin, because God's seed remains in them; they cannot go on sinning, because they have been born of God. ¹⁰ This is how we **know** who the children of God are and who the children of the devil are: anyone who does not do what is right is not God's child, nor is anyone who does not love their brother and sister.

¹⁰ that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹ and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

First Part of the Message

John begins Chapter three with these amazing words:

¹ See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God!
At this point John gets so excited that he is exclaiming: AND THAT IS WHAT WE ARE!
It's not ordinary love, but lavish - abundant, underserved and overwhelming. This love that

makes us children of God not based on merit but grace – abundant grace. Do you know that you are someone who is profoundly loved by the creator of the universe? Are you living in a way that reflects this knowledge?

John goes on in v2: ² Dear friends, now we are children of God, and what we will be has not yet been made known. But we know that when Christ appears, we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is. How amazing we shall be like him Are we growing in Christlikeness? Even if we are having a great day in living in a Christlike way – non Christians may not recognise that Christlikeness.

John has already referred to that failure to recognise so that we are not depressed about it:
^{1b}The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. Even Jesus was not recognised as the Son of God by many in the world – hence he was crucified.

John and God both want us to have the assurance that we are growing in Christlikeness and John says: ³All who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure.

A short detour back to Chapter 1of this letter. I remember one night reading my bible by candlelight after the generator had been closed down at 9pm in rural Zimbabwe and I saw with clarity the implication of verse 9 of chapter one ⁹ If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. I had known and preached many time about the forgiveness of sins on the condition of confessing our sins. Because it is so profound that we are forgiven our sins on confession, I tend to be so overwhelmed at the generosity of God that I had failed to really notice the final 6 words of that verse and purify us from all unrighteousness. That night, as the implication of these words struck home, I was even more overwhelmed that as I had confessed all the known (to me) sins, I was not only forgiven all that sin, but that for at least that moment I was cleansed from all unrighteousness – I was pure. How amazing is that! It probably wasn't long before some resentment reared its head, or I was angry with someone, or I wanted something someone else had (covet) etc etc and the purity had gone. But for those moments my access to the father was not hindered by sin, because Jesus had dealt with that and had purified me from even those things that I had not realised were sinful in my life – I was purified. The following day the Holy Spirit would remind me of other things that need confessing, I would confess them and again know the purifying effect of

forgiveness. As we do this day after day we are growing in Christlikeness until as verse 2 says ²But we know that when Christ appears, we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is.

May this hope motivate us to live in a way that reflects our destiny. ³ All who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure.

John then goes on to show the contrast between sin and righteousness

⁴ Everyone who sins breaks the law; in fact, sin is lawlessness. ⁵ But you know that he appeared so that he might take away our sins. And in him is no sin. ⁶ No one who lives in him keeps on sinning. No one who continues to sin has either seen him or known him.

John stresses the seriousness of sin ⁶ No one who lives in him keeps on sinning.

He longs for us to be increasingly free from habitual sin

John then contrasts the Children of God with the Children of the Devil

Children of God – practice righteousness and love

Children of the devil persist in sin and reject love

Think of a tree and its fruit: A good tree naturally bears good fruit. As children of God, the fruit of our lives should reflect his righteousness and love. Matthew records Jesus saying

¹⁶ By their fruit you will recognise them. Do people pick grapes from thorn-bushes, or figs from thistles? ¹⁷ Likewise, every good tree bears good fruit, but a bad tree bears bad fruit. ¹⁸ A good tree cannot bear bad fruit, and a bad tree cannot bear good fruit.

For Reflection: Examine your heart. Are there areas where sin persists? Seek the Spirit's help to grow in righteousness

Reading 1 John 3:11-24 More on love and hatred

¹¹ For this is the message you heard from the beginning: we should love one another. ¹² Do not be like Cain, who belonged to the evil one and murdered his brother. And why did he murder him? Because his own actions were evil and his brother's were righteous. ¹³ Do not be surprised, my brothers and sisters, if the world hates you. ¹⁴ We **know** that we have passed from death to life, because we love each other. John gives the example of Cain whose jealousy of his brother Abel led him to murder him – hatred leads to destruction, but love builds up and reflects God's heart ----

Love in action

¹⁸ Dear children, let us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth

John shows that true love us sacrificial as Jesus lays down his life

¹⁶ This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers and sisters

And that is must be a practical love – sharing our resources with those in need and standing with others in their struggles

. ¹⁷ If anyone has material possessions and sees a brother or sister in need but has no pity on them, how can the love of God be in that person?

Assurance and Confidence - in this final section of Ch 3-there are 5 knows!!

¹⁹ This is how we know that we belong to the truth and how we set our hearts at rest in his presence:

Confidence before God even when our hearts condemn us , God's love reassures us we know that God is greater than our hearts

God is greater than our feelings and knows everything

and he knows everything

Obedience brings Assurance - keeping God's commands, especially to love, strengthens our assurance. This is not about earning our salvation

we have confidence before God ²² and receive from him anything we ask, because we keep his commands and do what pleases him.

The role of the Holy Spirit

²⁴ The one who keeps God's commands lives in him, and he in them. And this is how we know that he lives in us: we know it by the Spirit he gave us.

²⁰ if our hearts condemn us, ,. ²¹ Dear friends, if our hearts do not condemn us, ²³ And this is his command: to believe in the name of his Son, Jesus Christ, and to love one another as he commanded us.

Trust in God's promises, not your feelings

Rest in the assurance that you are His child

1 John 3 reminds us of the incredible privilege of being God's children. His love calls us to purity, righteousness and love in action

As we live out these truths we reflect his love in a world that desperately needs him

For reflection. Ask: How can I show love more tangibly in my relationships and community?
